Village Garden



The English bluebells have really increased this year. They were planted two years ago and

the object is to allow them to spread in the bed as it is too dark and dry for much else to grow under the maple tree canopy. The Christmas tree, after looking very sad for a year or two is now looking very healthy, with mulching around the base and feeding. With the continuous long spells of wet on our sandy soil gardens and fields, the nutrients will be much depleted and it will need replenishing. Wild flowers though will love lower nutrients and they should flourish.

We have planted two small crab apple trees in the corner of the site where there is most light but it is under the canopy of another tree. Yes, I know we already have twelve trees on this small site which now must be to capacity. So to keep the capacity going I have planted many more plug plant trees in the wild grass areas of the playing field which will take a year or two to be really appreciated but will add to the biodiversity on the field without affecting the play area.

Still waiting for tadpoles in the pond, but they are late everywhere, so keep checking the pond through the railings on the side of the site.
