

Daneshill Lakes Update

The friends of Daneshill Lakes has now been wound up as no one was available to stand as chair, treasurer or secretary. We started the group ten years ago with the committee members staying the same for most of that time. They included a wildlife ranger, fishing club rep, sailing club rep, our local county councillor, the head of Notts County green spaces and my self as warden and maintenance and much more. Our role was to oversee the running and care of the site.

The core of the group will still meet but on a more casual arrangement with no bank account or official minutes being taken, but our work will carry on. The remaining funds are being spent on a new oak seat near the jetty and the replacement of the ROF information signs that were taken down some five years ago.

Looking to the future, the lakes are gradually being restocked with new fish, as some of the very large carp are now almost fifty years old.

Also, two large storage containers are replacing rotted old ones to house sailing dinghies for the sailing club.

Many of the old birch trees are coming to an end of their natural life and gradually fall over and smaller oak trees are growing to take their place. The willows will also be coppiced as this along with hazel is very good for wildlife. This all takes decades if not centuries, as long as man does not decide to concrete it over and build on it, like we see everywhere.

Wild Flower Alert



With heavy rain over the last months all plants have flourished. This is especially true with Hemlock growing in fields, hedgerows and other grassy areas.

Hemlock is a very tall variety of Cow Parsley and looks very pretty and delicate but it is **EXTREMELY POISONOUS!**

It is easily recognisable by its height, white flowers and purple spotted stem.

A few leaves eaten can kill or cause a severe skin rash if touched by humans, so a good idea to discourage your children from picking it.
